## Primaries Update

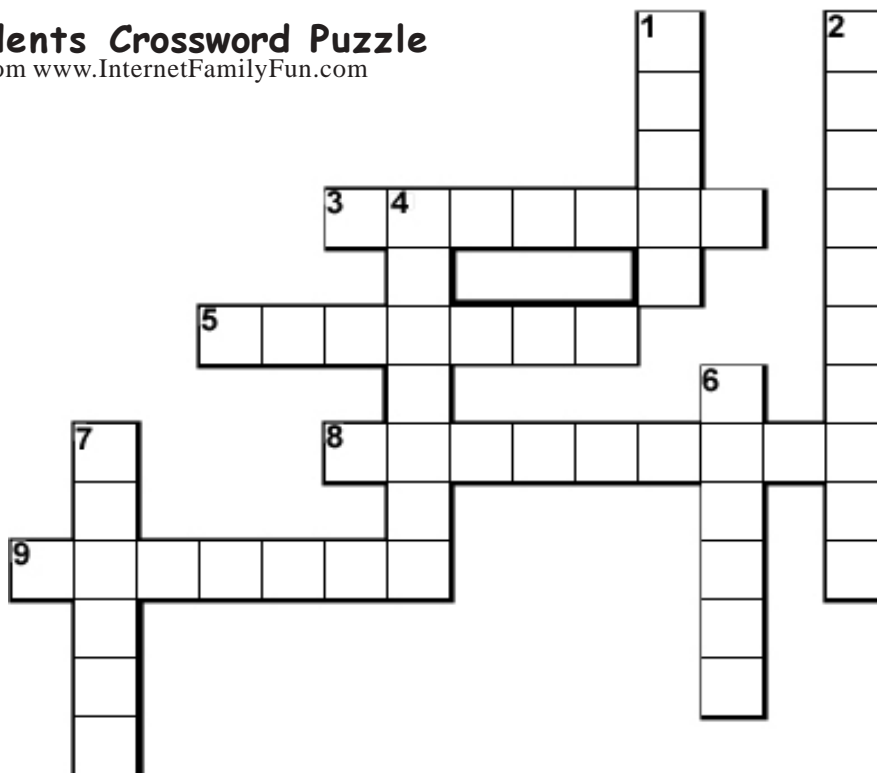

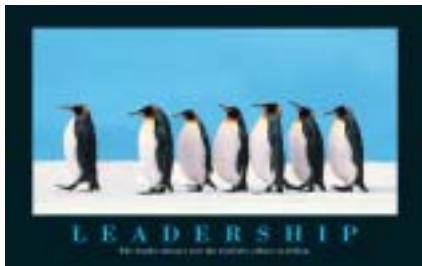

## Advisor's Corner

### Writing Goals with Objectives for the Junior and Teen Leadership Development Report

The purpose of the Junior and Teen Leadership Development project is to provide 4-H Members with quality opportunities and age appropriate experiences to develop and improve their leadership skills. The major duties of the Junior and Teen Leadership Development (2008) project include the following:

- “Work collaboratively with the adult leader to set goals, develop lesson plans, teach skills, and evaluate the activity.
- Coordinate logistical details such as meeting times, locations, materials and supplies, and expenses with the adult leader.
- Communicate with the adult leader and members about group expectations, responsibilities and expected outcomes.” (p. 1).

The first part of the Junior and Teen Leadership Development Report requires the Junior/Teen Leader to meet with the Project Leader to discuss specific goals the Junior/Teen Leader wishes to accomplish. Because goals are broad statements of what is to be learned, the Project Leader should present agreed upon objectives that are observable and measurable.

#### Examples of Leadership Goals

Upon completion of the project, the Junior/Teen Leader will:

- Know different ways to deliver content material;
- Understand time management skills using a day planner; and
- Learn communication techniques using motivational games and problem-solving activities)

#### Examples of Objectives

Upon completion of the project, the Junior/Teen Leader will be able to:

- Deliver a MS PowerPoint demonstration, small group activity, and team building exercise;
- Maintain a day planner to plan for meetings, organize equipment/supplies, and keep contact information; and
- Create and deliver motivational and problem-solving activities and evaluate the pros and cons of using each.

The second part of the Junior and Teen Leadership Development Report requires the Project Leader to evaluate if the Junior/Teen Leader met their goals. The degree of the Junior/Teen Leader’s success depends on those observable and measurable objectives demonstrated by the Junior/Teen Leader.
