## Primaries Group

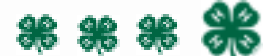

The entry forms are on line. All entry forms are due May 12<sup>th</sup> and must be signed by project leaders. Please read through the Fair Exhibit guide for the qualifications, deadlines, and entry fees. Make sure you also note the arrival time of your projects, as there are no late entries.

Project Leaders; please work with your project members before this deadline to ensure the applications are filled out correctly and on time, and the money is sent in. You have worked all year on your projects; don't forget to enter them in the Alameda County Fair.
