We may lose Ducks4Bucks if we do not decrease our balance in our account. We were planning to use that money to buy a projector. We also have to lessen the amount we take in from Ducks4Bucks. More of the money should go back to the members instead of the club to lessen the balance from our bank account. We plan on using the money for field trips or projects.
