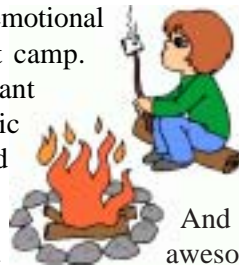

California Coastal Cleanup Day Saturday, September 15, 2007 - 9am to noon

This is the premier volunteer event focused on our country's marine environment. On this day, 50,000 volunteers turn out to over 700 cleanup sites statewide to conduct what has been hailed by the Guinness Book of World Records as "the largest garbage collection" (1993). Since the program started in 1985, over 750,000 Californians have removed more than 12 million pounds of debris from our state's shorelines and coast. When combined with the International Coastal Cleanup, organized by [The Ocean Conservancy](http://www.oceanconservancy.org) and taking place on the same day, California Coastal Cleanup Day becomes part of one of the largest volunteer events of the year. STATE 4-H LEADERS FORUM

It may seem a bit early to be thinking something in November but I wanted to remind everyone of the upcoming State 4-H Leaders Forum being held at Asilomar Nov 16th -18th. Remember, this is the only conference that California has for its adult 4-H leaders!

The State 4-H Leaders Forum provides a weekend retreat for 4-H volunteers across California to gather for networking, education, relaxation, and fun. Volunteers of all ages, experiences, and locations share this opportunity to further their volunteering "career," find new inspirations, and bring new ideas home to their counties and clubs. The conference is sponsored by the State 4-H Leaders' Council and the 4-H Section planning the conference.

A few things to you may not know:

- * The registration late fee deadline has been moved back until September 30th - after this time the registration fees go up by \$50 / per person.
- * Alameda County Council pays ½ of the registration if you come to the Leader's Council and give a report.
- * The conference is within driving distance!
- * The conference is held at Asilomar-a beautiful conference grounds right on the beach of Monterey Bay!
- * It's a great chance to learn more about 4-H, how to be a more effective leader, and to meet a lot of interesting people!

There are currently 200 guaranteed accommodations reserved with Asilomar and about 100 of them are currently registered. After 200 registrations are received the conference will have to take whatever rooms are available, if any, from Asilomar. Adult leaders that are interested should get their registrations in as soon as possible. Registration forms are available on the state web site www.ca4h.org/conference/slf/index
